1) PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

We would like to acknowledge that the land on which our school is located is on the ancestral Nuu-chah-nulth and traditional territory of the Hupačasath and Tseshaht First Nations.

1) Health & Safety:

The newsletter continues to feature Health & Safety reminders, such as:

- Please monitor your child's safety if you are using the school playground after school hours.
- Keep your child at home if she/he is sick.
- Next drill is a fire drill with the entire building on April 13th.

2) Events since our return from Spring Break include:

a. Meeting with all the parents (From Québec & Port Alberni) involved in the exchange group through Experience Canada last Monday night.

- b. To complete one of the educational modules from Experiences Canada, Mayor Sharie Minions was interviewed by D4 students to explain the role of a Mayor & discuss facts related to entrepreneurship and owning a business in Port Alberni.
- c. Visit from Mme Hélène in Mr. Michael's class, D2, who is Sharon Harper, Desmond & Donovan's grandmother's friend. Mme Hélène is also a former SD70 and CSF teacher who is now retired and who came to talk about Trois-Rivières & Lac St Jean, where she is from. Mme Hélène brought slippers that she knitted to give to the students.
- d. During recess, it is the end of the hockey season and the beginning of the soccer play. Please remind your child that this is a non-contact activity, and we ask to refrain from rugby and football tackles.
- e. Term 2 report cards went home Wednesday, April 5th.
- f. We also realized that because the Quebec group is coming June 18th-25th, Monday June 19th was a replacement planning day of Sept 2/Sept 19th, and the school was going to be closed. We would like the APÉ's approval to have it on June 16th which is the Friday before the group arrives. In this case, the school will be closed Friday June 16th instead of Monday June 19th, so we can have a regular school day with the Quebec group.
