PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

APÉ Meeting

1er octobre 2024

Welcome to all parents.

I would like to acknowledge the traditional, ancestral, unceded territory of the Hupacasath and Tseshaht communities and Nuu-Chah-Nulth First Nations, on which we are learning, working and meeting today.

### 1) Health & Safety

- · A reminder to discuss safety on the bus. Children should stay always seated, no leaning in the aisle, no eating or drinking on the bus, and no large sport equipment is allowed on the bus (No hockey stick, please).
- · Children should be dressed for rainy weather with boots and raincoat with hood.

### 2) Events last month

- The school had its first assembly on September 12 to review the code of conduct during recess, in the school, during transition, lunches, during P.E., and on the bus.
- •The students started their once-a-week dance lessons with Elite Dance Studio. Based on the school's projected budget, we may be able to pay close to half of the cost of the lessons (Total= 14 x \$300=\$4,200). We went from 59 students to 57, with one family who moved to Québec, so the amount will be confirmed at the end of this week.
- · The school had its first fire drill with the Jericho building. The system and fire extinguishers are all up to date.
- · We commemorated orange shirt day on September 26, and we had the superintendent's visit at school. The first Nation Elder, Irene Robinson, had a tree ornament made by an artist from the painted plates the students offered last year during her visit. The tree is posted on our FB page.
- •The djembe drum artist from Nanaimo, Louise Raymond, from Malicounda Dance, came to give 2 workshops to our K-Gr 3 & Gr 4-7, on Friday. Drumming was fun and therapeutic.
- · Gr 2-3 will be participating in the Apple Academy Leadership and Innovation Program by connecting with other students their age, using technology as a tool and shifting the belief that it is used for playing games. This program is carefully designed to create a balance between hands on activities and the use of the tablet. Mr. Michael is currently doing the training with all the school district teachers.
- The Terry Fox Day was a huge success. MANY THANKS to Kenzie, Lisa & Kevin Mathieson for their help preparing and serving lemonade & slush lemonade at school last Friday. We also want to thank all our parents who contributed to the run and the foundation. A special thanks to Karli Gibson for helping with the stretching exercises, and to Tomy Vezina, Stacy Dale, Giem Tran, Candy & Gavin Hastings, James Wingfield, Ray Eely and Gary Frechette for helping set up and packing.
- ·The school paid the registration fee for Experiences Canada/Quebec trip.

6. Quebec trip. How much do we need? And the logistics?

Money required for the Quebec trip (this is an estimate based on the last trip back in 2022)

APE has agreed to pay \$7500 up to \$8000 towards the Quebec trip. Currently, the APE account has a total of \$4,176.16 towards the Quebec trip. The remaining balance of \$3,323.84 is needed to cover the cost of the trip; this can be obtained as follows:

1st: Can be raised by the parents from grade 6/7 (kids that have confirmed their participation)

2<sup>nd</sup> Can be paid directly with the \$250. Parents should be paying a total of **\$632.28** per child (\$250 + \$382.38) to cover the cost of the trip.

### Logistics:

Experiences Canada is covering part of the cost of the trip. Parents won't be allowed on the trip due to the principle of this exchange. Please approach the principal Marie Pascal for a detailed explanation of the exchange.
